What an amazing anniversary year! 2025 was packed with events and projects.

Fifteen of us journeyed to Nantes, joined by artist Barbara Earl Thomas, chef Kristi Brown, and Councilmember Joy Hollingsworth to inaugurate the Jardin de Seattle and celebrate 45 years of friendship with the people of Nantes. We awarded six scholarships to incredible Washington students who are pursuing their French language studies this year in France. We played pétanque; we enjoyed wine and crêpes for la Chandeleur; we raised the flag for la Fête Nationale; we shared carrot ginger soup at the inaugural Sister City Soup Sampling; we watched 15 shorts from nine sister cities, including six from Nantes at the first ever Sister City Short Film Festival; we spruced up Nantes Park in the spring and later put it to bed for the winter; we shared our love of Nantes and France at three community events; we listened to La Chorale Francophone at their spectacular holiday concert; and most of all we enjoyed each other's company all year long!

Next year will be equally fun! The board got together for our annual planning retreat in early December and created the calendar of events for 2026, which you can read about later in this newsletter on page 8. Our goal is to have at least one social event each month, so that you have more chances to participate, starting with the private docent-led tour of the Farm to Table exhibit at Seattle Art Museum in January.

We have heard your feedback! We are considering several different options for the picnic with hopefully better parking! We're adding a second pétanque event and a holiday party. And you may have heard that France qualified for the World Cup! So far, they have no Seattle games, but they are scheduled to play one of our other sister city countries, Norway, so, of course, we are planning a friendly rivalry watch party with our colleagues at the Seattle-Bergen Sister City Association.






Annual General Meeting

Studying Abroad in Nantes

Hello from Nantes, France! I have been here for about three months now, and I'm loving it. Here are a few things I've been up to while here in France:


I am taking seven classes while here in Nantes- four at the Université de Nantes and three with I.E.S. (the institution I'm abroad with). I study English and French at my home university, and all of my classes here will go towards my French studies. I am taking a French grammar class, a translation class, an archaeology class, a literature of the Middle Ages class, an art history class, orchestra, and a teaching internship. I have orchestra rehearsal once a week, and we have a concert coming up on December seventh. My internship is four to six hours a week in a local middle/high school called Loquidy. This has really given me the opportunity to connect with French teachers and to see how the school system works. My classes at Université de Nantes have been lovely and it's been nice being able to meet and work with French students. I have learned so much while I've been here about a whole range of new topics (I'd never taken an archaeology class before this!) And, of course, my French has improved quite a bit, if I do say so myself.

I've mainly spent my free time exploring Nantes. I knew from the beginning that I didn't want to travel too much and that I wanted to get to know Nantes as a city. I feel I can say I've definitely succeeded in that! I live in downtown Nantes with my lovely host mom Michele, and I spend a lot of time exploring around our neighborhood. I've visited the Musée Dobrée, the Musée d'Histoire Naturel, the Jardin des Plantes, and the Île de Versailles (and many, many other places).

Now that it's close to Christmas, a Christmas Market has been set up in Place Royale. One of my favorite parts of my day is getting to walk past the market on my way home and see all the people and smell the wonderful food. Speaking of, there is so much good food in Nantes. My favorite restaurant that I've found is Le-St-Mihiel which can be found along the Erdre on tram line two at the stop St-Mihiel. They have really good fries, andouille, and hot chocolate. Every time I think I've found all the restaurants, a new one appears (same goes for cute boutiques).

I've traveled a bit with I.E.S. around France to Normandy, Brittany, and La Loire Valley. It's been lovely seeing other regions of France. If I'm not traveling or exploring, I'm definitely studying with my friends in a library or reading my eight hundred page book for my literature class.

Thank you for helping me be here and have this experience; it's truly been wonderful!





Supporting Our Scholarships

We have awarded over 90 scholarships since 1989 thanks to generous endowments, donations, and purchases at our fundraising events such as FrenchFest.

Our scholarships are open to students who live in Washington and have a passion for French and successful academic studies in the French language and culture. Our three current scholarships, the Goldmark, the Frances Bennett, and the Thomas H. Bennett, are all endowments meaning that they have additional requirements that are unique to each scholarship. For example, the Goldmark Scholarship is for college students specifically studying in Nantes while the Thomas H. Bennett Scholarship is for high school or college students studying abroad in a francophone country.

Having been on the Scholarship Committee for over a decade and chairing it since 2018, I have been consistently amazed by the incredible scholars who apply. It is an honor to get to know the scholars through our application process and stay connected with them as they advance in their French studies.

The quality of our applicants demands that our selection process be rigorous. Our Scholarship Committee examines all the applications which consist of an essay, a transcript, and two letters of recommendation. All applications are evaluated using a rubric that is aligned with the specific qualifications of each scholarship. If qualified, applicants advance to the second round, which is an interview with the Scholarship Committee. Based on the qualifications of each applicant and our scholarship budget, the Committee brings recommendations to the SNSCA Board for awarding the scholarships.

Each scholarship awards up to \$2,500. This year, we were grateful to be able to offer six scholarships thanks to your continued donations to our scholarship program.

Holiday Bazaar



I went through my emails and found my first correspondence from Larry from December 2012, only a few weeks after he joined the Board. Larry’s message to the Board responding to us brainstorming a venue for la Chandeleur started with: “Friends, I happened to walk past the Crêpe Café (65th and Ravenna) today on a bagel run...” This message made me smile, because it is indicative of many amazing suggestions that Larry offered over the years that were actualized; the first reference of this being that SNSCA’s 2013 la Chandeleur event was indeed held at Crêpe Café as Larry suggested.

Over the years, I have had the joy of running into Larry more than once while out and about at cultural events. His love of art, food, and beer has benefited advancing the mission of the association as noted by some important collaborations that Larry spearheaded such as the Native art exchange and beer exchange.

From July 2020 to September 2020, large photos of art by Joe Seymour Jr (Squaxin Island/Pueblo of Acoma), Alex McCarty (Makah), Peter Boome (Upper Skagit), and Micah McCarty (Makah) were on display outside the Musée d'Histoire Naturelle in Nantes as part of the exhibition titled Nature Native. While the artwork was on display in Nantes, all four artists participated in virtual presentations for SNSCA members; the recordings are still available at seattle-nantes.org/native-art. Larry was able to draw upon his deep appreciation for Native art and culture and longtime connection with the late Makah artist Alex McCarty to make this memorable art exchange a success.

When Susan Kegel shared with the Board the idea of doing a beer collaboration, Larry offered his knowledge of craft beer and connected us with Chris Engdahl of Lantern Brewing. Chris teamed up with Nantes’ Bubar Brasserie to create the unique 8000km beer that consisted of cranberries sourced from Washington and sel de Guerande from France. The result of the collaboration was not only the beer, but Chris became a great supporter of SNSCA, and we ended up hosting several events at Lantern Brewing.

Larry has helped at many events over the years from helping deliver books to FrenchFest to gardening at Nantes Park. I always have appreciated the fresh ideas that Larry brought to our Board discussions and his dedication to making those ideas happen.




