Letter from the President

It's been a busy spring and summer for Seattle-Nantes! We are preparing for our exchange of delegations to celebrate our 45th anniversary of twinning with the beautiful city of Nantes. Plus we have added several new events to our calendar, so that we have programming this year in every month except June!

In September, a delegation of 16 association members will accompany Councilmember Joy Hollingsworth, Chef Kristi Brown of Communion Restaurant and Bar, and artist Barbara Earl Thomas to Nantes for a week of events, visits, and exchanges. The city of Nantes will be inaugurating the Jardin de Seattle, based on the parks and gardens that we showed them when they visited here in 2022. They will also be unveiling the garden gates designed by Barbara Earl Thomas. (For a sneak peek, check out our website). There will be Seattle-themed music, food, and sports open to the public on the weekend. The culmination will be a gastronomic dinner at the Cantine du Voyage created by Chef Kristi and Chef Lucie.

CM Joy Hollingsworth will meet several deputy mayors and visit sites to share best practices in our two cities on the topics of parks and green space for mental health, engaging and supporting youth, keeping cities clean and safe, and multi-use and affordable housing.

Delegates will also be welcomed with a reception at Nantes City Hall, attend the cocktail opening of the Décryptages exhibition and conference on the theme of borders at the Cosmopolis International Exhibit Hall, learn about Nantes' latest urban renewal project as they turn an abandoned quarry on the Loire into a 4-acre garden inspired by native son Jules Verne, visit the marshes where people have been harvesting salt by hand for over 2,000 years, and much more.

Delegates received their host family assignments recently and are starting to make contact. Lifelong friendships are formed on these trips. Delegations like this are one of our core missions: to share our respective cultures, to form lasting and meaningful connections between people, and to be inspired for future collaborative projects that we can share with the Seattle community when we return home. Look for ways you can participate in welcoming our Nantes friends when they visit us in October!






Bastille Day Picnic

Preparing for the 45th Anniversary Delegation Visit




45 years ago, on September 7th 1980, Seattle city dignitaries and a group of citizen volunteers interested in France welcomed the inaugural delegation of its newest sister city - Nantes, France. One day later, Seattle Mayor Charles Royer and Nantes Mayor Alain Chenard signed a joint resolution officially adopting Seattle and Nantes as sister cities; pledging to each other mutual friendship, respect and commitment to establish and maintain a long-lasting and productive sister-city relationship.

This October, the Seattle-Nantes Sister City Association will welcome the 45th anniversary delegation from Nantes, continuing a tradition of city delegation visits every five years. The Seattle delegation will visit Nantes this September.

The Nantais will arrive on Saturday, October 18th and stay through Saturday, October 25th, with the option to stay an additional week and experience an American Halloween. Be on the lookout for various delegation events to take place during the visit.

Chenard leads a delegation of government officials and civic leaders from Nantes who are visiting Seattle to observe the signing of sister-city documents and to assist today with the inauguration of a Jules Verne exposition at the Pacific Science Center.


