We are planning next year's events as you read this, but we already have confirmation that FrenchFest will resume in person in 2023 and we will be there with our bouquiniste offering! We also have some good news for our Nantes Park project – we have a confirmed contractor to do the final step of pouring the walkway and embedding the Claude Ponti creature footprints, aiming for March or April once the weather improves.

### 2022 Year in Review

- FrenchFest we enjoyed virtual tours of the Chateau de Goulaine, Le Dilemme restaurant in Nantes, a Muscadet winery, and the salt marshes of Guérande along with a live cooking demonstration of beurre blanc.
- Nantes Delegation to Seattle we hosted about 40 delegates from Nantes in April for a week of events and discussions.
- Nantes park Inauguration we completed 2/3 of the Nantes Park Beautification and threw an excellent party with delicious food and live music, despite the weather.
- Seattle Delegation to Nantes we took a group of 9 to Nantes in September hosted by our colleagues at La Maison des Etats-Unis.
- We awarded two scholarships to WA students studying French.
- We maintained the Seattle-Nantes geocache at the Olympic Sculpture Park, which received literally hundreds of visitors in a couple of days in August for an international geocaching event.
- We wined and dined a geocaching delegation from our colleagues at Geocaching Pays de la Loire.
- We celebrated with Beer, Books, and Bastille in person at Lantern Brewing.
- We stepped up our presence in Nantes Park with 4-5 weeding and mulching events between March and October.
- We closed the year out with another in-person event at L'Experience on Mercer Island.





In early December, I had the privilege of returning to Nantes in support of Councilmember Herbold's presentation at the **Colloque International Ville & Santé mentale**. This was the first in a hoped-for biannual international conference on how cities can improve the mental health of their citizens, to be hosted by different cities around the world. The event was attended by about 850 people from 30 cities in Europe, Africa, Asia, South America, and North America. Our Seattle delegation was the only representative from the US. The two-day event featured presentations and round table discussions on four topics:

- 1. Urban planning, architecture, nature in the city and mental health
- 2. Work, economy, temporality and mental health
- 3. Art, culture, sport and mental health
- 4. Vulnerable populations and mental health

CM Herbold spoke during the 4<sup>th</sup> session, focusing on what Seattle and greater King County are doing with respect to the mental health issues of the homeless and youth populations, including among other things new funding in next year's city and county budgets, tiny house villages and JustCares initiatives, and the new 988 number.

CM Herbold and I also met with a number of city officials and deputy mayors to discuss participatory budgeting, the Atlanpole start-up incubator, Nantes' creative district, and their gender-neutral-city initiative. In addition, I met with the team designing the new Jardin de Seattle and the Floralies 2024 committee. Stay tuned for more on both of those fledgling projects in the new year.

Finally, we had a lovely brunch to connect CM Herbold with the three associations that SNSCA is currently working with in Nantes: our long-time friends at La Maison des Etats-Unis, Geocaching Pays de la Loire, and France Etats-Unis. (France Etats-Unis is the organization that put together our SNSCA FrenchFest program this past year.)
