## Seattle International Film Festival

During the 2016 Seattle International Film Festival, SNSCA sponsored three films: *Come What May*, *The Innocents*, and *Summertime*. For each film, we had ten complementary tickets for the membership.

Interestingly enough, all of the films we sponsored were period pieces. *Come What May* is set in 1940 and follows the emotional journey of a small French village that flees for the coast as the Nazis approached.

*The Innocents* takes place at the end of World War II in 1945 Poland. A young French Red Cross doctor is sent to Poland to help survivors of the war; however, the doctor finds a new mission ends up helping a group of pregnant Benedictine nuns.

The film *Summertime* is set in 1971 and follows the love story of a young farm girl who moves to Paris and meets a charismatic feminist. The couple learns that their love is not as accepted once they leave Paris and return to the countryside.

## Annual Summer Picnic

More than 25 people attended the Annual Summer Picnic on Sunday, July 17<sup>th</sup>. There was a nice turnout with both longtime and new members. As in recent years, we had a shelter and several picnic tables on the shore of Lake Washington at Madrona Beach.
