Since 1989, Seattle-Nantes Sister City Association's scholarship program has supported over 80 students. In March, the Scholarship Committee, Susan Hulbert, Marsella Logan, Bunny Schmidley, and myself, interviewed our scholarship applicants. Following those interviews, I am delighted to announce our 2024 scholarship recipients Mikaela Seelke and Basil Elsner.

Mikaela Seelke is majoring in Environmental Sciences and French at the University of Washington. Mikaela has been involved with a number of different activities that demonstrate her interests such as participating in UW's French Club, volunteering with UW's Study Abroad Buddy Program, and being a student volunteer for the Burke Museum Herbarium. In the fall, Mikaela will be studying in Nantes with the support of the Goldmark Scholarship. We look forward to keeping in touch with her as she studies and explores our sister city.

As a current junior at Olympia High School, **Basil Elsner** is our first high school student to apply for and be awarded the Dr. Thomas H. Bennett Scholarship. Basil demonstrates incredible leadership skills as captain of his rugby team and Knowledge Bowl team and has tutored French. Basil explores his passion for French by watching French television, listening to French music, and learning about French art, gastronomy, and history. This summer, Basil will complete an intensive proficiency-based French language course at the Accord Ecole de Langues in Paris. We hope Basil's experience in Paris provides him the challenge that he is looking for as he gains proficiency in French.

Jardin de Seattle on Track for 2025 Inauguration

In Nantes' largest park, a new area dedicated to Seattle will evoke the city's landscapes and identity. The garden was designed by urban agriculture students and Nantes' Nature and Gardens Department team. SNSCA connected them with UW's Curator of Living Collections for expert consultation on typical Seattle plants. The garden will comprise various groves of fruit trees and shrubs, herbaceous plants and climbers. It is crisscrossed by paths and a stream, and includes a central, wood-lined, amphitheater-shaped plot. A central feature is a nourishing forest. The thematic focus on an edible and mainly fruit garden is linked to the importance of fruit production in the Seattle area and, more broadly, in Washington State. The fruit forest concept was inspired by the Nantes delegation visit arranged by SNSCA to the Beacon Food Forest in 2022. This innovative form of permaculture will be the first of its kind in Nantes. Inauguration is expected in 2025, coinciding with our 45th anniversary of twinning.

Seattle Artist Featured in Jardin de Seattle

A focus of the garden will be a work of art by a Seattle artist commissioned by the city of Nantes. SNSCA worked with our colleagues in Nantes to put out a call for submissions in fall 2023 with the final decision made in February 2024. I am thrilled to announce that the chosen artist is Barbara Earl Thomas! Her website is: <u>https://barbaraearlthomas.com/</u>. You may remember her amazing show at the Seattle Art Museum, Geography of Innocence, in 2020 and another show at the Henry Art Gallery, Packaged Black, in 2021. Coincidentally, it turns out that she is a former SNSCA board member, though this will be her first trip to Nantes!



SNSCA to Co-Sponsor Seattle Europe Day Festivities

On May 9th, 1950, exactly five years following the conclusion of World War II, French Foreign Minister Robert Schuman proposed the Schuman Declaration to merge French and West German coal and steel production into a single operating authority, a move centered on pacifying international relations through political and economic integration. Over the next year, the Netherlands, Belgium, Italy, and Luxembourg all joined the alliance, and in 1951 the Treaty of Paris was signed, creating the European Coal and Steel Community. Europe's first supranational community eventually served as a cornerstone for the founding of the European Economic Community, and ultimately, the European Union.

Today, the European Union observes Europe Day on May 9th as a day to celebrate peace and unity in Europe. It should be noted that the Council of Europe observes Europe Day on May 5th to commemorate its founding on that day, but both observances share the same mission.

The Seattle-Nantes Sister City Association is delighted to co-sponsor Europe Day festivities in Seattle this year, in partnership with our friends at L'Alliance Française, the World Affairs Council and the Seattle-Gdynia Sister City Association. Our Europe Day 2024 gathering will be on **Thursday, May 9th from 5:30pm-7:30pm** at the MLK F.A.M.E. Community Center in Madrona. All are invited to enjoy food, drink, and activities highlighting the Seattle Sister Cities and diversity of Europe. Additionally, Dr. Chiara Pierobon, visiting professor at the University of Washington, will share her research on "Europe as a Global Actor" in a keynote speech and audience discussion. Admission is free, but RSVP is required. We hope to see you there!
